Last chances to steam up the Scarp this year



Hotham Valley Railway reports that steam trips from Pinjarra to Dwellingup and return will finish in October because of the increased fire risk. Wednesdays and Sundays during the next few weeks will be the last remaining opportunities that local residents have to steam up the Scarp for this year.

Philip Moore, Hotham Valley Railway's Volunteer Coordinator, told the Murray Community Newspaper, "Our volunteers really enjoy the steam season, but it has to end soon and won't restart until May next year. The fire risk just becomes too great as the ground dries out"

Philip said that the railway continues to operate from Dwellingup using diesel locomotives during the summer, with the Saturday Restaurant Train and the Saturday and Sunday Forest Trains continuing to be popular services. "So the volunteers still have plenty of work to do," he said. "But there is nothing like a steam train ride to give passengers a real thrill and to take them back to the days of powerful steam locomotives climbing a steep railway track." he added.

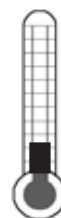

RANDALL DECLARED IN CANNING



Mr Randall is congratulated by Danny Wallace, Canning Division Returning Officer AEC in Armadale last week.

Don Randall was officially returned as the Member for Canning at the declaration of polls during a short ceremony at the offices of the Australian Electoral Commission in Armadale last week. Mr Randall said that with 46.18 per cent of the primary vote and 52.19 per cent of the two party preferred vote, he was proud to have been elected by the people of Canning.

Mr Randall said on entering his fourth term as the Member for Canning he remained as committed as ever to achieving real outcomes for local residents. Well known as a dedicated, hard-working local representative, Mr Randall said last months election had been the toughest he had faced and had been a "hard fought affair from day one".

Mr Randall nationally the election results had been bittersweet with the Coalition coming "within an inch" of forming Government. Speaking after the declaration Mr Randall said he was "disappointed the two country independents in Mr Windsor and Mr Oakshott for backing Julia Gillard's government".

"It's a shaky deal that's not good for policy renewal," he said. "I suspect their electorates are not very happy about it either. Take the example of Rob Oakshott where less than 15 per cent of his electorate voted Labor and yet he's now helping Labor form a Government with the Greens and the independents.

"Ms Gillard and her colleagues made a lot of promises to Canning residents about what a Labor government would deliver and I'll be making sure that they do as they have promised which includes a large investment in improving the health of Peel waterways."

Speaking at the ceremony Danny

Wallace, long serving Divisional Returning Officer for the AEC, congratulated Mr Randall on his victory and wished him well for the next three parliamentary years. Mr Randall now holds the seat of Canning on a reduced margin of around two per cent.

Mr Randall thanked Mr Wallace and all the AEC staff for their professionalism, cooperation and assistance during the campaign and looks forward to working with them throughout the next term of Government.

Pam inspired the ladies with a display of different items she had made from an array of beads, material, wool, papers, recycled plastic bags, wood, metal and even fish scales.

Pam also informed the ladies on the history of the dorset button, which probably began in years 1680 to 1700. The first buttons were known as "High Tops" and were made from a disc of horn from the Dorset Horn Sheep. It was covered by a small piece of material and worked with a needle and thread to make a conical shaped button.

Other acts include local guitar maestro Craig Sinclair, The Flying Carpathians, Carl Pannuzzo and Penny Larkins, Victorian political satirist Bruce Watson and Eddie Cole.

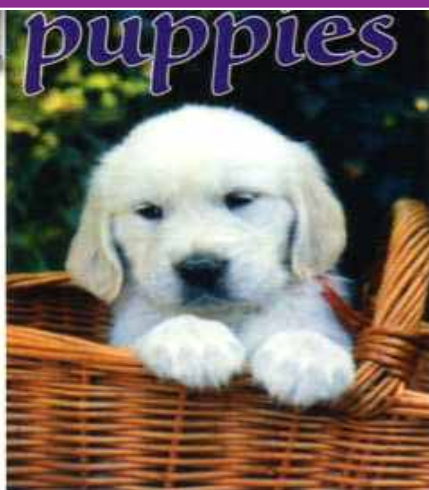

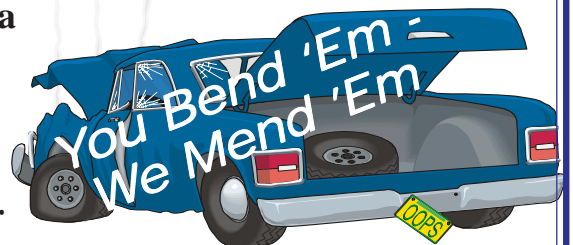

On behalf of the local community Murray Cowper MLA would like to congratulate four local school girls on being selected to compete at the National Interschool Equestrian Championships in Sydney.

Coolup's Gabriella D'ercole and Sarah Sellin, North Dandalup's Olivia Lodding and Pinjarra's Mikaela Thaw will join 52 other young Western Australian riders to represent WA at a national level at the end of September in Sydney.

350 riders competed in the State Interschool Championships in April this year, representing their schools from across WA.

Their subsequent success earned them the honour to represent Western Australia in Sydney.

"I'm extremely proud of these girls. They've shown a lot of commitment and put hours into training after school to succeed and

to be able to compete nationally", Mr Cowper said.

"I'm pleased to be able to support the girls, in a modest way, by assisting parents with the costs involved".

WORLD CHAMPION TAKES OUT THE DWELLINGUP 100 MOUNTAIN BIKE CLASSIC.



Reigning World 24 hour Mountain Bike Champion Jason English showed that he was in a class of his own at the Dwellingup Mountain Bike Classic on Saturday. The Port Macquarie school teacher bided his time riding with last years winner Jon Gregg and other local favourite Chris Fisher for the first fifty kilometres until they reached the Turner Hill Super section, it was here where he made his move.

Around the eleven kilometre Turner Hill section English broke away taking 2 minutes over his two closest rivals. From there until the finish line he put further 8 minutes into the two closest rivals to win in a course record of 4hrs 8 minutes 48seconds. Fisher and Gregg rode together all the way to the finish with Fisher outstripping Gregg to take out second in 4hrs 18 minutes, with Jon Gregg .

In the women's race Queenslander Jodie Willett proved that her pre race status of race favourite was well founded. Using similar tactics as English, Willett rode with last years winner Stephanie Russell (WA) for the first 50 kilometres, and made use of the technical section at Turner Hill to make her break. Over the remaining fifty kilometres she increased her pace to gap Russell and take the event in a course record time of 4.49.46. Russell rode strongly to finish second in a time of 4.54.22 with Rhianna Farrell 5.37.22 coming in third

The 2010 Dwellingup Mountain Bike classic attracted a record field of 780 riders, which was up by 120 over last years inaugural event.



PRESIDENT'S NOTES

I am delighted to report that on the 21st September, the Shire of Murray became the first local authority in Western Australia to benefit from State Government funds under this year's Royalties for Regions Country Local Government fund.

The Murray Shire was the first local authority to submit its audited Forward Capital Works Plan and this resulted in a funding allocation of \$834,000 being approved by State Government towards the new Aquatic Centre project in Pinjarra. The Minister for Regional Development, the Hon Brendon Grylls, praised Council for the manner in which the Shire had made its submission and for being 'the first cab off the rank'.

He said that it was these efforts that had achieved such a good result.

This funding assistance means that the new Aquatic Facility, complete with lap pool, leisure pool and a hydrotherapy pool will be able to be completed and up and running by February 2011. With the accompanying upgrade works being undertaken at the Murray Leisure Centre the Shire will have an iconic facility to offer to its residents, ratepayers and visitors.

GORGEOUS GARDENIAS



The Gardenia (Gardenia Augusta) is a lovely flowering shrub with a beautiful fragrance that can add a romantic atmosphere to the garden. They are a low maintenance plant that flowers in the warmer months of the year and grows well in our climate.

Enjoying Gardenias

- Gardenias are great plant to use to form a small to medium hedge as they are evergreen with lovely glossy green flowers.
- The delightful fragrance of the abundant flowers can add an enchanted perfume to the garden as you walk past.
- Their pretty creamy white leaves (of the Gardenia Florida – the most common variety) are lovely to use as button holes or in small, single flower vases.
- Gardenias can be grown and pruned to form a standard in pots with proper care.
- They can also be great to decorate the garden in the lead up to Christmas because they will generally flower through the summer months.

Caring for Gardenias

- Gardenia's like a moist, well drained, acidic soil.
- Water them especially in summer to spring.
- They do like some sun, but make sure get some shade and are protected from the full afternoon sun or summer heat.
- Make sure you don't plant them in very windy areas, or protect them from the wind.
- The Gardenia flowers do bruise easily so make sure you handle them with care.
- Give them a feed in spring and summer with a slow release fertiliser.
- As they are low maintenance they won't need a great deal of pruning unless you want to – i.e. for hedging or as a standard.

Good luck with your Gardenias; they really are a gorgeous plant.

Murray District Historical Society

Held its 2nd Annual General Meeting at the Murray Library in Pinjarra on Tuesday 24th August. Murray Shire President Cr. Noel Nancarrow attended the meeting and was invited to take the Chair for the election of office bearers and committee for the coming year.

Cr. Nancarrow addressed the meeting and entertained with reminiscences and stories of life in Pinjarra before the 1970's - i.e. the pre-Alcoa era. He took us on a tour of Pinjarra, starting with a nostalgic journey down George Street when IGA was a movie theatre and there were two taxi ranks! Pinjarra had a lifestyle of its own - there was a one-lane road to Mandurah and monthly shopping excursions to Perth by train. There was respect for the police and strong friendships formed at Schools - the local Junior High and the Convent.

The present library and Shire offices are on the site of the former football ground and grandstand! Cattle was driven over the Pinjarra bridge and sheep were shorn at the rear of Edenvale. The swimming hole at Munday's Hill was a popular meeting place for the young and the Pinjarra Race Track has been an institution since the 1880's. The ghosts of Old Blythewood, of Edenvale and of the Shire Offices are still accepted, welcome residents!

Noel also spoke of the future of Pinjarra - a most important part of the Peel Region. He spoke of the necessity to balance development and agriculture; growth and heritage; practical lifestyle and tourism. But he agrees that precincts such as Edenvale must be protected, 'samples' of heritage preserved and memories recorded.

The next meeting will be Wednesday 27th October, at the Murray Library - 7.00pm, the guest speaker will be Mr Brendan Widdowson, Social Enterprise Manager at Fairbridge Village. Brendan will speak about the history of Fairbridge and of the life and aims of its founder, Kingsley Fairbridge. He will also speak about the aims of Fairbridge Village in 2010.

This year marks the 150th Anniversary of the 1860 construction of Old Blythewood homestead south of Pinjarra. Warden Vince Taylor has agreed to host the Christmas Function, at Old Blythewood on Friday 10th December. You will enjoy a Christmas High Tea, festive entertainment and the guest speaker will be former Police Commissioner Brian Bull who is actively involved with the Police Historical Society.

The afternoon activities will commence at 2.00 pm.

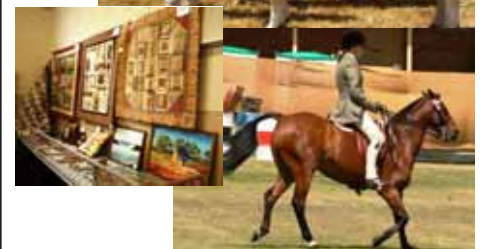

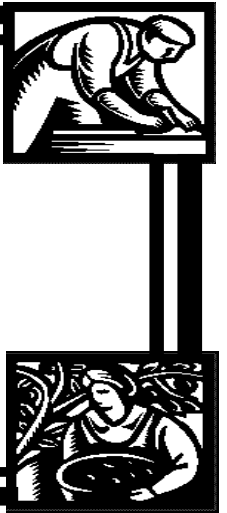

WHAT IS THE FUTURE FOR CLASSIC CAR EVENTS IN WAROONA??

The "All Australian Car Day" (AACD) & "British Auto Classic" (BAC) are now two of the largest Regional events of their kind in WA. This October, the ninth of these events held since their move to Waroona in 2006, will see the number of visitors attracted reach almost 100,000 and the new expenditure injected into the local economy go well over \$2.5 million. Not a bad effort for a very small number of dedicated volunteers who make them happen.

They have been supported over this time by the State Government's, Peel Development Commission, initially with Regional Development Grants and currently by Royalties for Regions Grant (R4R) over two years, which will expire after the April 2011 AACD.

Other major funding comes from Lotterywest & Healthways both of whom have backed this initiative since the beginning and hopefully will continue their support. Long time private sector sponsor Shannons will likely support these events for as long as they happen. As will the Senior & WA Water Corporation. Alinta who were with us for over three years (7events), have now finished their construction in the local area and consequently are no longer involved. NLV, Harvey Beef and MALZ have all come and gone.

The Federal Government's Regional Development Australia PEEL WA has provided some important funding in recent times and may be a future funding source.

To their credit there are a number of local small businesses who are now supporting these events in various ways. However, the big disappointment is that large Industrial Corporate Citizens, who claim to be "Building Stronger Communities" and financial institutions who talk about "Community", refuse to support our work which does all of that and offers them a real opportunity to change their rhetoric into actions and obtain a benefit through association with our initiative, which does boost the local economy and build social capital.

The main threat to the future of Waroona's Classic Car Events is that as the cost of staging them increases, the funding to support them is dwindling. For instance, the cost of providing toilet facilities, to supplement the inadequate fixed facilities alone, is \$4,400 per year and the loss of R4R funding after April 2011 will see some \$10,000 cut from the income side of the annual budget.

It has been suggested that we charge for

entry but a survey revealed that people in the main would only pay a gold coin for this. Not surprising, as the majority of attendees travel a long way to be here and they are the ones who bring the new money to the area. Therefore the cost of securing the venue, collecting the entry fee and all that entails, would result in a loss. Also of course the lesser number of people, having less to spend with the traders = less traders and less income from trade sites.

Another option would be to reduce our costs by removing some of the facets of the events. The largest cost is that of staging the All Day Variety Show, with shade structures, dance floor, PA equipment and artist fee etc. However, if that goes then so does more of the funding which is specifically linked to it.

So the future is bleak after 2011, the local community groups who work so hard to support the effort, may lose their six monthly windfall and the region will miss out on 25,000 visitors and \$500,000 in new expenditure each year. Down will go the areas financial sustainability and take social capital with it. We have less than a year to turn it around. Any ideas?
